



COVID-19 update from Lakeside Campground

June 26, 2020

Interim Update: After receiving guidance from the Broome County Health Department, Lakeside has opened the playground. The pavilion is also available for rent, so long as activities continue to comply with local/county direction with regards to size of gatherings. Patrons should continue to employ social distancing and/or use of masks.

June 5, 2020

Interim Update: After receiving guidance from the Broome County Health Department, Lakeside Campground has opened the beach and bathing area. Social distancing protocols and other limitations apply. At this time, pavilions and playgrounds must continue to stay closed.

May 1, 2020

We hope you and your families are well, healthy and safe during this unprecedented time in our nation's history. The health and safety of our workers, customers, and community is our highest priority as we navigate this difficult and stressful time.

At this time, the Broome County Health Department has provided guidance under which we can open as scheduled on Friday, May 1st. We know these are challenging times for everyone, and our goal is to be able to provide a clean, relaxing outdoor space for our patrons, while adhering to CDC and national guidelines to keep everyone safe during their stay.

Based on guidance from our local Health Department, all group activities are cancelled until further notice, and areas of potential congregation such as the pavilion, playground, and beach will be closed. Bathhouses and the campground store will have modified operations to ensure compliance with social distancing and health & safety guidelines. All registered guests and visitors to the campground will be required to provide their personal contact information to campground management, and all customers will need to abide by CDC guidelines, such as social distancing, use/wear of masks as needed, and appropriate hand hygiene and disinfection. There will be increased cleaning and disinfection of public areas, especially frequent touch points such as doors, door knobs, levers, countertops, and RV hook-up points (electric pedestals, water spigots, and septic caps). Remote reservation and check-in/check-out procedures will be available for your convenience. Please help us all stay safe and continue to

have access to your camping facilities by abiding by all posted rules and guidelines. Specific Health Department guidance (information and attachments) are included below.

Broome County Health Dept guidance:

1. Social distancing guidelines apply to all campers and staff. They must maintain a safe distance of at least 6 feet from others at all times. When 6 feet is not possible a face mask/covering must be worn.
2. All common areas must remain **CLOSED**. This includes but is not limited to: community buildings, playgrounds, pavilions, communal campfire pits, dining areas, swimming pools, bathing beaches, etc.
3. Bathhouses and restrooms must remain open and must be cleaned and sanitized twice a day or more depending on patron usage.
4. Food Service Establishments are still **take-out ONLY**. Food service workers must wear masks while preparing food and interacting with customers.
5. **No gatherings allowed**. Campers shall not congregate at another camper's campsite.
6. All campers must register themselves and anyone else who may be staying at their site including any guests/visitors. Contact information should include: name, address, phone number, and email. Operators must be able to supply this information if requested by BCHD for contact tracing.
7. Campground operators must provide the attached COVID-19 guidance to all campers upon check-in at the campground.
8. Operators should do occasional spot checks to ensure that social distancing guidelines are being maintained.
